Weaving Creativity and Connection Through Jewish Women's Stories - Reaching out with Chesed - acts of loving kindness - helps us build a sense of belonging and connection to community. The Art of lyyuning - The word lyyun comes from the Hebrew root for eye/seeing. lyyuning is what happens when a group of people come together, over time, around deep or gnarly problems to "thresh" out new understandings and new actions. The act of lyyuning is the engine of Jewish learning and adaptation: a core privilege historically accorded to (certain) Jewish men and actively denied to Jewish women. In The Art of lyyuning, we introduce you to the core principles and creative power of lyyuning to collectively rise to the promise and problems of this moment in time.
