

Our Sisterhood Mitzvah



Hanukkah with the women of Congregation B'not Or (The Jewish inmates at the California Institution for Women)

Program Description & Purpose



This Tikkun Olam project was triggered when several Sisterhood women attended a Passover Seder at the California Institution for Women. The Jewish inmates commented that they were left out when the Christian groups provided Christmas packages to the other prisoners. Our Sisterhood decided to remedy the situation. All Sisterhood members were encouraged to donate money or purchase toiletries. We packaged them and arranged for them to be brought into the prison.. We required a maximum of 45 bags. Then, at the Hanukah celebration at the prison, the Sisterhood representatives handed out a gift bag to each lady. The affect was most inspiring as the women were moved by the generosity and caring of a group of strangers. Later, at the request of the prison, we were asked to consider note cards, because of security concerns.

These women are a forgotten and ignored part of our community and our Sisterhood felt the need to correct that.



Program Involvement



Members of the Sisterhood as well as members of the congregation purchase the packets of note cards and bring them to the Temple to be collected, sorted and put into clear plastic bags. Each bag must have an equal amount of cards in it. The bags are then picked up and taken to the prison to go through security once the appropriate paperwork has been filled out, well before Hanukkah. Then at a set time during Hanukkah, I, as the liaison (between the Sisterhood and the Residents), and my husband and sometimes a Sisterhood member or our Rabbi participated in a lovely Hanukkah celebration with singing and the lighting of the candles and enjoying Latkes and cookies, sponsored by the Residents and their Rabbi. Then the packets of note cards are distributed.

While many of the Sisterhood women participated, only a few were able to be cleared to enter the prison.


